Gary Jerome Dempsey, Sr., of Dayton, Nevada, 75, died March 31, 2020 at his home with his wife by his side after a long battle with cancer.

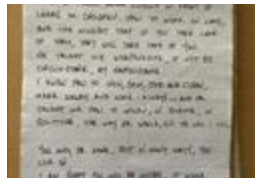
